Anne Rice's "Vampire Chronics"

The Avengers

After five movies from the Marvel Studios canon, here is one giant epic assemblage that combines the best superhero story elements and fills it with grandiose adventure. This time with writer/director Joss Whedon, a filmmaker perfectly suited for this kind of material, he manages to balance the exact amount of action, charm, humor, wit and character giving us a roller-coaster that will amaze you for its entire 143 minute runtime. Essentially, the cast can be summed up as 'The Dirty Dozen' or 'Guns Of Navarone' of superhero movies.

The story is that simple to follow. Loki from 'Thor' is out for revenge and plans to

rule the earth by teleporting other worldly aliens for death and destruction. Nick Fury, who was introduced earlier in Iron Man 1 and 2, head of S.H.I.E.L.D brings forth the ideas of the Avengers Initiative as a last resort to save all human life. The initiative includes a band of ragtag heroes pinned together to stop Loki's madness. But there's a catch, as stated by Bruce Banner in the movie "We're not a team, we're a time bomb", all heroes may or may not work well with each other. The genesis of this conflict traces itself back to the original comic storyline that first established the Avengers. Here's a team who have a hard time getting through each other let alone trying to save the world. The essence in watching all actors play out their characters in full effect is because Whedon has done a great job balancing their emotional arcs into one container. The writing is crisp with ever-fast dialogues from all the characters to the directing of fight and battle sequences of all characters, plus a great few nods to the original character arcs when they appeared in the story lines.

Robert Downey Jr . gets to steal most of the spotlight with his crackerjack Tony Stark. Chris Evans makes a wonderfully vulnerable Captain America. Chris Hemsworth swings back into action as Thor. Scarlet Johansson really shined in this one as Black Widow, getting enough space to extend her character. Mark Ruffalo was the one that stood out with his interpretation as Bruce Banner and Hulk. He really picked up the intensity well from Edward Norton and Eric Bana. Samuel L. Jackson as Nick Fury, Cobie Smulders as Agent Hill and Clark Gregg as Agent Phil Coulson all hold their own in supporting acts. And Loki as played exceptionally well by Tom Hiddleston in the final deserving catch of the movie.

On the technical art side, the visual effects are the major standout offering a great visual extension of the characters that inhabit the screen. The shots rendered of the Hulk, Iron Man and the creatures that destroy the city in the climatic battle will wow audiences unlike ever. Every other department from production design to cinematography or sound are at the top of their game filling in the experience as the movie progresses.

The only consideration you might want to do before watching The Avengers is watch the movies that built up to this one. It's not as important since even for a standalone film, you don't require that many explanations. The pace can be slow for some but it's justified for building up their arcs towards the end of the movie.

For the start of 2012, here is a great blockbuster epic, one that is smart and mindful of how to have fun at the movies. Your expectations won't be disappointed.

1. What do you think about this School Otherwise week?

"I think it has meant a challenging experience both for students as well as for teachers. We have been confronted with situations we've never been through before and, as much as the next person, we find the unknown both exciting and scary."

"In my opinion, this School Otherwise week breaks the daily routine; it changes this universe of letters, numbers and information a little. It certainly has its usefulness, because it stimulates the students, it makes them be creative, taking into account the fact that it is based on non-formal education methods."
